# OASAS Primary Prevention Program

**Hope For Youth's Outpatient Substance Use Clinic**, licensed by the New York State Office of Addiction Services and Supports (OASAS), provides specialized treatment for children and adolescents with substance use disorders or those affected by a family member's

substance use. Our multidisciplinary team offers diagnostic assessments, individual and group therapy, and family counseling to youth involved in foster care, probation, or the child welfare system. Through individualized treatment plans, education, and

supportive services, we help young people and their families build the skills needed to achieve healthy, substance-free lives.



# An OASAS Success Story

Client G was referred to Hope For Youth's Outpatient Clinic following an emergency DSS placement and participated in the 7 Challenges substance use program. He entered services after experiencing a chaotic environment marked by trauma, strained family relationships, gang involvement, and substance use. Initially withdrawn and unsure who to trust, G struggled with emotional regulation and communication.

Through individual and group counseling, G began addressing his trauma, building healthier relationships, and developing coping skills. Despite multiple placement changes and therapist transitions, he remained committed to his goals of anger management, sobriety, and personal growth. Today, G recently celebrated one year sober, has taken on leadership roles in NA meetings, improved his academic performance, and gained employment. His progress reflects remarkable resilience and determination to build a healthier life.

## Electrical Union Training Programs

IBEW Local 25 Electrical Union Minority Caucus is dedicated to empowering and mentoring individuals pursuing careers in the electrical industry through education, guidance, and hands-on training opportunities. In partnership with Hope for Youth, the caucus hosts both Basic and Advanced Electrician Courses designed to teach youth foundational and advanced electrical skills while providing mentorship from experienced union professionals. Through these programs, participants gain practical knowledge in areas such as wiring, electrical theory, switch operations, paneling, and safety practices, helping prepare the next generation for successful careers in the trades and creating pathways toward long-term economic opportunity.



# Nassau PINS Diversion Program



Through the Nassau County PINS Diversion Program, our team provides short-term, intensive, in-home, family-centered services for youth struggling with truancy, runaway behaviors, mental health challenges, substance use, and family conflict.

Using evidence-based Multidimensional Family Therapy (MDFT), we strengthen communication, build problem-solving skills, and connect families to community supports – keeping youth safely at home and out of the court system.

# Wendy's Wonderful Kids



In 2025, Hope For Youth proudly continued its implementation of Wendy's Wonderful Kids, a signature program of the Dave Thomas Foundation for Adoption, dedicated to helping children waiting in foster care move one step closer to safe, loving, and permanent homes.

Through this evidence-based, Child-Focused Recruitment Model—proven to be up to three times more effective in serving children who have been in foster care the longest, including older youth, sibling groups, and children with special needs—our two Wendy's Wonderful Kids recruiters diligently served Nassau and Suffolk counties. Working with intentionally smaller caseloads to ensure individualized attention and meaningful engagement, **our recruiters successfully matched six youths with**

**potential adoptive resources, and one youth achieved permanency through legal guardianship finalization.** These outcomes reflect our continued commitment to creating lasting, stable connections for the young people we serve.



# Adjustment Services

Referrals to the Adjustment Services Program are made directly by the Suffolk County Department of Probation and primarily involve youth who have never appeared before a judge, offering them the opportunity to avoid Juvenile Delinquency (JD) status. The program receives an average of 1–3 referrals per week. Upon referral, a Restorative Conference is convened with the Center for Restorative Practices, the youth, their family, a probation representative, and a Hope For Youth Case Manager—along with the victim when possible—to develop a written agreement outlining required actions such as counseling, community service, or substance use treatment, including clear timelines. If challenges arise, a Compliance Monitoring Conference is held to address barriers

and reinforce accountability. The case concludes with a final Restorative Conference and a comprehensive progress report to the court. In addition to preventing detention or OCFS placement, the program aims to

reduce re-arrest, gang involvement, and school absenteeism while improving court and probation compliance. **In 2025, 92% of participating youth were successfully adjusted and avoided JD status, and 100% avoided re-arrest.**



## Intensive Supportive Case Management

Hope For Youth's Intensive and Supportive Case Management (ISCM) program is an outpatient preventative service designed to provide children and their families with the support and treatment needed to stabilize a youth's immediate living situation and prevent placement into foster care or a higher level of care. As a contract program with the Suffolk County Department of Social Services, all referrals are made directly through the Department. ISCM staff build strong working relationships with youth and their families while connecting them to community-based resources that provide ongoing support and help maintain the family unit. **In 2025, ISCM served 44 youth and discharged 30; of those discharged, 97% remained in their current living situation without requiring placement in a higher level of care.**



# Foster Care Program



Hope For Youth provides safe, supportive temporary homes for children and youth working toward reunification, adoption, or independent living. Children are referred by the Nassau and Suffolk Departments of Social Services, as well as Probation for PINS and JD youth who have completed higher levels of care.

Our enhanced training and certification programs prepare foster families to support youth in Regular, Therapeutic, and Emergency (short-term) Foster

Care, as well as through Wendy's Wonderful Kids (Dave Thomas Foundation for Adoption).

We are committed to thoughtful, timely placements that promote healing, stability, and permanency. Each child is carefully matched with the most appropriate family to prevent multiple placements and ensure the best opportunity for success. Placements are often made the same day for non-therapeutic youth and within a week for therapeutic placements.

In 2025, Hope For Youth had placed 24 children into foster homes, with 16 successful discharges to a parent/guardian or adoption – reflecting our strong focus on permanency and positive outcomes for youth and families.

Hope For Youth provides ongoing support, evaluations, and comprehensive foster parent training through the trauma-informed, culturally responsive National Training and Development Curriculum (NTDC), ensuring high-quality care for every child we serve.

# A Foster Care Success Story



Sam was placed in a foster home with Stephanie and Michael through Hope for Youth in January 2023. Before coming into care, Samuel had been placed with LIAFS due to domestic violence, substance abuse, and unsafe living conditions in his biological home.

When Samuel first arrived, he faced challenges adjusting. He struggled behaviorally and academically and had difficulty adapting to the structure and expectations of his new home. At that time, he often expressed that he wanted to return to his mother and father,

not yet fully understanding the circumstances that led to his placement. He also experienced a significant transition when he transferred schools.

With time, consistency, and support, Samuel began to thrive. Through dedicated therapy services at Hope for Youth and the steady encouragement of Stephanie and Michael, his behavior and mental health improved tremendously. His academic progress was especially remarkable—his grades improved so much that he no longer required an IEP.

Most importantly, Samuel began to feel safe, supported, and truly at home. He made the heartfelt decision that he wanted to remain with Stephanie and Michael, recognizing this was where he belonged. Their family embraced him completely, loving and supporting him as if he had always been part of their lives.

In November 2025, Samuel's journey came full circle when he was officially adopted by Stephanie and Michael—a joyful and permanent step that made their family whole.

# Health Home



## Success Story: Building Momentum Beyond Placement

One powerful example of Health Home’s impact involves a teenage girl referred through Hope For Youth’s Intensive and Supportive Case Management (ISCM) Program. While ISCM provides focused support over an approximately six-month period, Health Home services were able to continue beyond that timeframe, ensuring sustained guidance and stability.

When first referred in 2024, she struggled with school attendance and consistent engagement in services. Through ongoing collaboration between ISCM and Health Home, she became increasingly open to feedback and actively involved in her goal-planning process. Over time, she strengthened her connection with her service team, built confidence, and developed greater motivation toward independence.

Today, she is consistently engaged in services, working part-time, and applying to college courses as she pursues a career as an ultrasound technician. The seamless partnership between ISCM and Health Home provided both immediate intervention and long-term support—empowering her to remain focused on building a stable, successful future.

## What Is a Health Home?

A Health Home is not a place—it is a coordinated, team-based approach to care. Service providers work closely with each child and caregiver to ensure families receive the services and supports they need to stay healthy. Once enrolled, each family is assigned a dedicated Care Manager who develops a personalized Plan of Care to support the child’s social, emotional, mental, and physical well-being—both now and in the future.

## Who Is Eligible?

Children and youth ages 0–20 with active Medicaid coverage may be eligible if they have experienced physical, social, or emotional challenges that impact healthy development or their ability to achieve life goals.

Hope For Youth is a proud member of the Collaborative for Children and Families (CCF), a Health Home network comprised of medical and behavioral health providers specializing in comprehensive services for children and families. Health Homes also collaborate closely with other Hope For Youth programs, providing additional layers of support and continuity of care—even after a child’s placement or involvement in another program has ended.

# Youth ACT

**Youth Assertive Community Treatment (ACT)** is a program licensed by the New York State Office of Mental Health and designed to meet the significant needs of children and adolescents ages 10 to 21 who are at risk of entering—or returning home from—high-intensity services such as inpatient or residential treatment. Through a multidisciplinary, team-based model, Youth ACT delivers intensive, community-based mental health services that support youth with serious psychiatric needs in remaining safely in their homes and communities whenever possible.

Youth at risk of institutional levels of care often require highly coordinated and comprehensive interventions. The ACT team partners closely with each youth and their family to address complex behavioral health challenges, reduce the need for higher levels of care, and ensure successful transitions back into the community.



In 2025, Youth ACT demonstrated strong outcomes across key areas of functioning and stability (see statistics below). Among participating youth. These outcomes reflect Youth ACT's commitment to providing intensive, wraparound support that promotes stability, accountability, and long-term success for youth and their families.

showed a reduction or improvement in symptoms related to their mental health diagnosis.

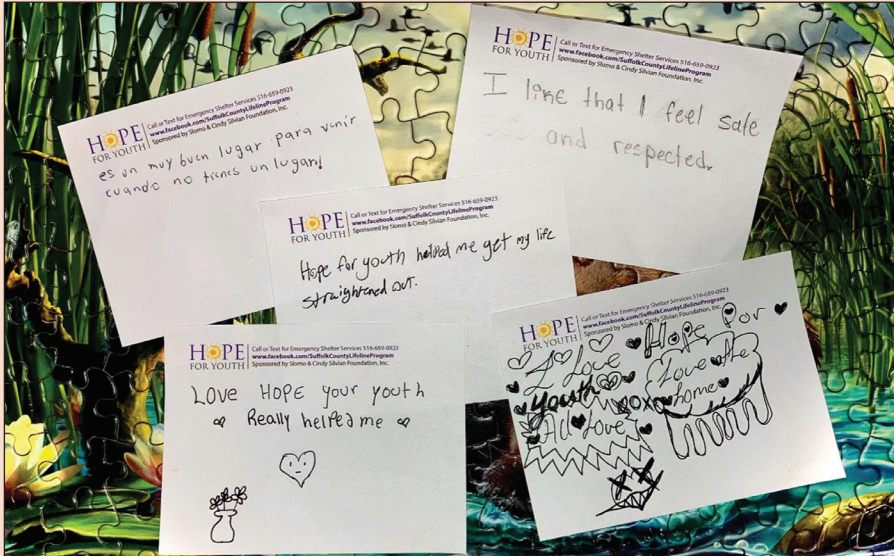

# HEART Program



**In 2024, the HEART program served 75 families, and over 120 children across Nassau County for intensive preventive services.**

There were 20 families in particular who showed significant improvement in their parenting skills, which reduced the risk of foster care and improved family dynamics.

30 families remained together and were successful at meeting their goals and closing preventive services

# FOCUS Program

Families Overcoming Crisis Through Unified Court System (FOCUS) continues to support parents who have temporarily lost custody of their child(ren) due to substance use. FOCUS has been an additional supportive service offered to parents while they are seen in Family Treatment Court. Hope For Youth has worked collaboratively with Suffolk County Family Court for the past six years. In reviewing this year, since October 2025, we have enrolled 12 new clients with a carryover of 6 from the prior year and 8 new clients pending. Within the past year we have had 11 clients graduate from the FOCUS program, which highlights successfully completing their mandates which included family sessions at Hope For Youth utilizing Child Parent Psychotherapy, completing their substance use treatment program, maintaining recovery and achieving reunification with their children. HFY works with the parent and the child to address the bond between them and their attachment focusing on helping parents reflect on how their own early experiences and behavior impacts their family. In addition, the goal is to enhance the parent's ability to understand and meet their child's needs.



# Transitional/Rapid Rehousing

Working alongside the Long Island Coalition for the Homeless, Hope For Youth is dedicated to providing youth, and their dependents, with low-barrier, self-determined housing options that meet their needs and support housing permanency.

This Program is a state-licensed, federal, Suffolk County, and Mother Cabrini Health Foundation funded program available to homeless youth in Nassau and Suffolk County between the ages of 18–24.

All youth will be offered individualized case management services, counseling, independent living skill groups, and care coordination to support their successful move to permanent housing. Youth residing in our Transitional Housing program will be supported by trauma-informed therapeutically trained staff 24/7 and youth residing in Rapid Re-Housing sites will have the support of our case manager.

Each youth accessing services will be supported for up to 90 days after

discharge from the program to assist them in navigating housing obstacles and overall well-being.



## Families Thriving Together (FTT)

Families Thriving Together (FTT) is one of Hope For Youth's newer programs that began in June 2024. The program provides therapeutic services to children of all ages, family members and significant others who have been impacted by substance use. During this time period the program has spent time introducing the program within the community to help families connect to services that can help them manage challenging situations when it comes to substance use disorders within families.

To date there have been sixty-one individuals that have had some intervention through FTT, attending 397 distinct sessions that provided support, understanding, new approaches and/or healing within the family impacted by substance use.

### An FTT Success Story

Ms. Green attended sessions with her two daughters, aged 4 and 2. Ms. Green, a recent single parent, as her significant other and the girls' father, passed away from a drug overdose. Ms. Green also had experienced an overdose herself which led to her seeking help from multiple resources.

**When Ms. Green initially began participating in the FTT program, she presented herself with a depressed mood, often appearing despondent and sad, rarely smiling, or interacting with her children. She also showed frustration when her children exhibited dysregulated behavior especially when the older child exhibited more problematic and defiant behaviors. In working with the FTT program, Ms. Green was able to better understand the trauma her children experienced as well as behaviors they exhibited due to loss and separation. In conjunction with FTT, she participated in treatment for her substance use disorder. As Ms. Green engaged in SUD treatment and FTT she thrived, demonstrating her own personal growth. She became less emotionally guarded in that she was able to reflect joy and understand that her children would eventually respond accordingly. In addressing the traumatic themes, she and her children experienced, she was also able to identify how her own trauma with her family of origin affected her and her parenting style. As such with FTT, she was able to develop a more cohesive and successful parenting approach while attending to the needs of her children. In addition to gaining insight and personal growth, Ms. Green was able to complete her programs, maintain employment, and secure housing.**

# Outpatient Substance Abuse Clinic

Hope for Youth's Outpatient Substance Use Clinic, licensed by New York State OASAS, helps young people and families break the cycle of substance use and build healthier futures. Our multidisciplinary team provides individualized counseling, family support, and specialized care for youth involved in foster care and the juvenile justice system.

At Hope for Youth, we don't just treat substance use – we help young people rediscover their strengths, reclaim their voice, and move toward stable, productive, substance-free lives.



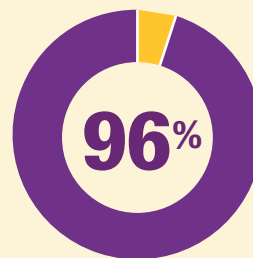
**In 2025, HFY's Outpatient Substance Use Clinic served over 108 young people. Below is an overview of the success of the services provided:**



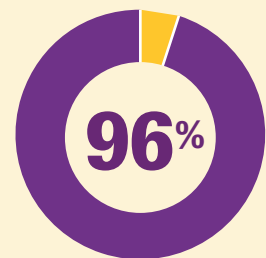

# Child Mental Health Rehabilitation Services (CMHRS)



Hope For Youth's CMHRS Program provides comprehensive, Medicaid-funded mental and behavioral health services to children and adolescents ages 0–21. Our licensed social workers, licensed mental health counselors, and bachelor-level support staff deliver individualized, family-centered care designed to strengthen emotional wellness and long-term stability.

Using evidence-based practices recognized by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services and the New York State Office of Mental Health (OMH)—including Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT), Trauma-Focused CBT, Motivational Interviewing, and Child-Parent Psychotherapy—each child and family receives a comprehensive assessment and a personalized treatment plan tailored to their unique goals.

Eligible Medicaid clients may access services through Other Licensed Practitioner (OLP), Community Psychiatric Support and Treatment (CPST), and Psychosocial Rehabilitation (PSR). HCBS referrals are coordinated through qualified Health Home Programs.

## CMHRS 2025 Impact

**95%** experienced a reduction or elimination of mental health symptoms

**96%** increased social relationships and interpersonal skills

## A CMHRS Success Story

Client F came to Hope For Youth through our Community Psychiatric Support and Treatment (CPST) program – a service designed to help young people build coping skills, strengthen family relationships, and succeed at home, in school, and in the community.

At the time, she was struggling with school conflicts, emotional regulation, and communication challenges with her mother. Through individualized support, skill-building, and family work, Client F learned to better manage her emotions, advocate for herself respectfully, and communicate more effectively at home.

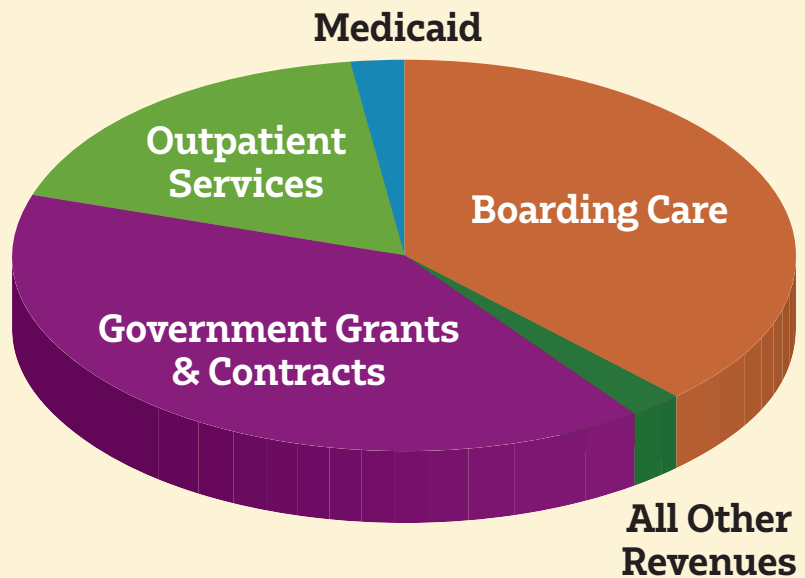

Today, Client F has graduated from CPST services and is preparing for college – equipped with the resilience, independence, and self-confidence to thrive in her next chapter.

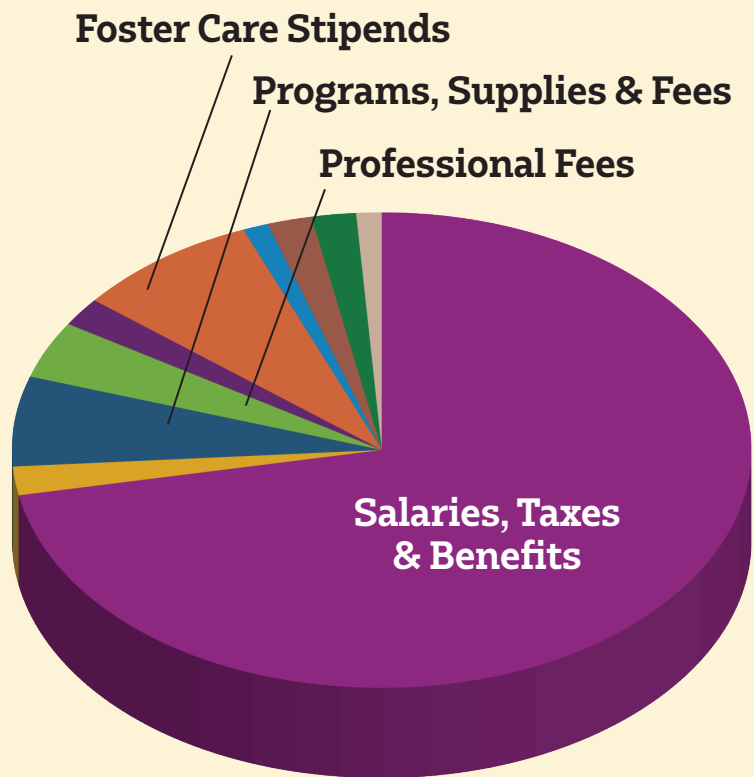
